We had a record five dames attend the conference in Louisville, each one came back inspired by the mission of LDEI. We are all looking forward to hearing their insights from the conference.


One last thing, for those of you who have not renewed your membership it is not too late, you can still register on the website. If you are on hiatus please let us know.




