

This first-ever session covered chapter history, roles and responsibilities of the Board and committees, and details on our philanthropic work. ## Business Grant

Two Bay Area Women Chosen to Receive \$5000 Business and Mentorship Grants from San Francisco Chapter of Les Dames d'Escoffier—International

Led by chair Dame Mary Gassen, a diligent awards committee of LDE-SF Dames Maryam Ahmed, Linda Carucci, Duskie Estes, Mary Gassen, Emily Luchetti, Sue Conley, Janet Griggs, Marsha McBride, and Dominica Rice-Cisneros recently selected two deserving winners of our chapter's inaugural 2023 Les Dames d'Escoffier—San Francisco Business Grants. Each award consists of a \$5000 cash prize plus one year of mentorship with members of our chapter to support the winner in the particular areas of business that she has identified.

The winners are **Stephanie de la Cruz of De La Creamer**y in Oakland and **Wendy Lieu of Socola Chocolatier** in San Francisco.

Thanks to the outreach efforts of several of our chapter's well-connected Dames, information about the two grant and mentorship awards reached a wide swath of Bay Area women who own and operate businesses in the fields of food, wine, hospitality, farming, etc.

The application process took place online and the awards committee was overjoyed to have received more than 20 completed applications by the deadline. Applicants had to demonstrate that they've been in business since at least January 1, 2022 and they were required to submit two years of P&Ls demonstrating revenue of no more than \$1M. Five finalists were interviewed on Zoom and each finalist's place of business was visited by **Dame Mary Gassen**.

Awards committee Dames were truly inspired to learn about the business operations—and hopes and dreams—of so many talented, hard-working women who applied for these grants.

This year's awards have been made possible by the generous support of Mijenta Tequila and the fundraising efforts of the San Francisco chapter of Les Dames d'Escoffier—International, as well as the commitment of mentoring time and talent of our chapter's Dames. We hope to make these awards annually.

The committee's final task will be to fête the winners and introduce them to our chapter at a gathering in early 2024. Stay tuned for further details. (Summary submitted by Dame Linda Carucci)
