Benefit for Maui - Support our fellow chapter's work - August 26th at Compline in Napa


6:00 pm-8:00 pm - Compline Restaurant and Wine Shop - 1300 First Street, Napa

October 1, 2023 Screening of MFK Fisher film The Vogue Theater, San Francisco

The long awaited documentary film about the life of M.F.K. Fisher, known affectionately as "A Poet of the Appetites" will premiere on October 1st at the Vogue Theater in San Francisco. We held a special event years ago to hear about the creation of the film and now it has come to life. Details about the screening and tickets will be forthcoming.

San Francisco film director Gregory Bezat created the film after meeting writer MFK Fisher in the 90's. Bezat stated, "This is my dream project. As a filmmaker, I want to bring M.F.K. Fisher's striking voice and powerful story to the screen. Her voice transcends food. It is ultimately about companionship, friendship, and a curiosity to understand others. We are exploring Fisher's perspective on the profound indoctrination that fast food culture has imposed on America. As a filmmaker, the goal is not to pound the viewer with how horrible fast food is, but rather to leave the viewer with an overall feeling for a rich, vibrant American food culture."

- Demonstrates excellence and a range of writing (either a variety of topics or broad coverage on a single subject)*
- Shows relevance to today's food/wine/social justice landscape in her/their writing
- Has not more than ten years full-time in the field of food journalism
- Is not a Les Dames member

Confidential nominations came from our chapter members and also previous recipients. The review committee, which includes Dames Janet Fletcher and Margo True plus several of the fellows, are currently evaluating the candidates. We plan on announcing the 2023 Fellow at the General Member Meeting and New Member Induction on Monday, September 18 as well as in the accompanying chapter reports.

Business Grant


Mark your calendars! Applications open on September 1st for our first LDEI-SF Female Entrepreneur Grant and Mentorship!

Dame Mary Gassen reports that the LDEI-SF Female Entrepreneur Grant and Mentorship program aims to provide crucial support to female-owned businesses in the food, culinary and hospitality industry in the vibrant San Francisco Bay Area. Through cash awards of \$5,000 this initiative seeks to empower and propel these businesses forward by facilitating expansion and the enhancement of their operations. To be eligible for this grant, applicants must identify as women, be non-members of Les Dames d'Escoffier, and fulfill specific criteria. These requirements include having commenced business operations on or before January 1, 2022, being a female-owned establishment serving or located within the San Francisco Bay Area, and maintaining an annual revenue of less than \$1 million. Furthermore, applicants are expected to submit profit and loss statements for both 2022 and the year-to-date of 2023. Applications for the inaugural year's TWO grants will be accepted through our website September 1, 2023 - October 12, 2023. Please get the word out to business owners who fit the criteria and encourage them to apply online after the link goes live on September 1, 2023.
