New Member Induction Dinner Monday September 18 Foreign Cinema

Monday September 18, 2023: Chapter Welcomes 18 New Dames at Sold-Out Foreign Cinema Dinner

The annual new-member induction and business meeting opened on a festive note at Laszlo, the intimate cocktail lounge adjacent to Foreign Cinema. Fortified with martinis and glasses of Domaine Carneros Brut Rosé Cuvée de la Pompadour, more than 60 members connected over delicious nibbles from the Foreign Cinema kitchen, including warm, two-bite arancini and crisp chick-pea panisses topped with caviar. The seated dinner in Foreign Cinema's Modernism West Gallery, a high-ceilinged private room decorated with vintage Ukrainian film posters, merged business with pleasure (although even the business was fun). The delicious meal was accompanied by Eco Terreno and Skylark wines.

Incoming co-president Frankie Whitman introduced the inductees not with their bios—provided in a handout and uniformly impressive—but with a lighthearted and fast-paced question round. What do you read for inspiration? How many nights a week do you cook at home? What changes have you implemented in your kitchen to be more sustainable? President Pam Mazzola introduced the nominees for the 2024 board of directors: co-presidents Dame Pam Mazzola and Dame Frankie Whitman, 2nd vice president Dame Emily Luchetti, vice president of Member Engagement Dame Kara Nielsen, treasurer Dame Nancy Ash, secretary Danielle Fiala and Tonya Pitts. Dame & Board Secretary Danielle Fiala announces she and her husband have opened Doctorbird Market, a specialty food market located in Old Town Pittsburg. They will celebrate its Grand Opening from the 28th to the 30th of September, following a soft opening earlier this month that coincided with the return of the city's celebrated Seafood and Music Festival.

Husband-and-wife team Danielle and Zane Fiala have poured their hearts into creating a welcoming and warm atmosphere that fosters a sense of community and appreciation for food and drink. The market is intended to function as a corner store (albeit a fancy one) for Pittsburg residents who enjoy good food and cooking at home.

Customers of the market will be treated to an ever-evolving selection of wines, craft beer, freshly roasted coffee beans, as well as seasonal selections of high-quality snacks and pantry items—"ingredients people are excited to cook with." The products in the shop are thoughtfully sourced, with a focus on local producers, family-run businesses, and makers from underrepresented communities.


